LAVENDER

(Lavandula sp.)

With its aromatic purple flowers and gray-green foliage, this lovely European native is perfect for bouquets and sachets. Just follow these simple instructions and you'll enjoy a healthier, longer blooming plant. And, enjoy your gift with the warm wishes of the thoughtful person whose name appears on the outer address label.

PLACEMENT

Indoors, display your lavender in a sunny window, where it will receive as much natural light as possible (ideally, three to four hours of direct sunlight per day). For even growth and flowering, rotate your plant weekly. Keep in a well-ventilated area, away from heating or air conditioning vents. In spring, your lavender plant may be set outdoors or planted in the garden. If kept in its pot, it should be brought indoors before fall's first hard frost. Always set the container on a protected surface to prevent water damage to furniture.

WATER AND FERTILIZER

Allow the soil to dry slightly between waterings, then drench thoroughly. Never let the soil dry out completely. If kept outside in the spring and summer, your lavender will need to be watered more frequently. During spring and summer, fertilize every four weeks with a commercial houseplant food, according to the instructions on the product label.

PRUNING AND REPOTTING

After your plant has finished blooming, trim the branches to encourage new growth. As your plant grows, repot it into a larger container with a standard houseplant soil mix, or transplant it in your garden.
